Introduction before starting service – Justin

Lighting of the Advent Candles – Rev. Maria

3rd Sunday of Advent: Joy

Celebrant:

"The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor." Luke 4:18-19

We light this candle in the western direction, the direction of the setting sun and symbolizing autumn, the time of the harvest. We light this candle thankful that Christ brought good tidings, the promise of new life—the blind receiving sight, the lame walking and the prisoner set free. We light this candle, thankful for our adult responsibilities, for seeing how we may help to make the world a better place for our children and grandchildren. We rejoice that Christ has set us free!

Prayer: Creator, strengthen our weak hands that we may find your holy way, the way of the redeemed where joy and gladness live. May we understand our own gifts and bring teachings for the good of our communities and for the world. May we do the work that Jesus has given us to do with purpose and joy.

Reader: The Good News of Deliverance

The spirit of the Lord God is upon me, because the Lord has anointed me; he has sent me to bring good news to the oppressed, to bind up the broken-hearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and release to the prisoners;
to proclaim the year of the Lord's favour.

Gospel John 1:6-8, 19-28 - Rev. Maria

Reader: The Lord be with you. People: And also with you.

The Testimony of John the Baptist

¹⁹ This is the testimony given by John when the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, 'Who are you?' ²⁰ He confessed and did not deny it, but confessed, 'I am not the Messiah.' ²¹ And they asked him, 'What then? Are you Elijah?' He said, 'I am not.' 'Are you the prophet?' He answered, 'No.' ²² Then they said to him, 'Who are you? Let us have an answer for those who sent us. What do you say about yourself?' ²³ He said, 'I am the voice of one crying out in the wilderness, "Make straight the way of the Lord"', as the prophet Isaiah said.

²⁴ Now they had been sent from the Pharisees. ²⁵ They asked him, 'Why then are you baptizing if you are neither the Messiah, nor Elijah, nor the prophet?' ²⁶ John answered them, 'I baptize with water. Among you stands one whom you do not know, ²⁷ the one who is coming after me; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandal.' ²⁸ This took place in Bethany across the Jordan where John was baptizing.
