Lighting of the Advent Candles - Rev. Maria

4th Sunday of Advent: Peace

Celebrant: "A virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and his name shall be called Emmanuel: God with us." Matthew 1:23

> We light this purple candle in the direction of the north, the place of sweeping winter winds, and northern lights, the time of year when stories are told on long evenings. We light this candle remembering that we ourselves bear witness to "God with us" through the example of love in our lives. We light this candle representing the time of our lives when we are elders and our stories are told with wisdom and experience. We bear witness to our Creator's promise to be *Emmanuel*: God with us.

Prayer: Creator, you gave us the gift of Emmanuel, God with us. May we bear witness to the presence of Jesus in our lives and in our communities. May we share the good news of Jesus' promise to be with us always to the very end of the age.

People: Amen.

The Peace (P.192) - Rev. Maria

Celebrant: The peace of the Lord be always with you. People: And also with you.

Grace (P.185) - Rev. Maria

Celebrant: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit, be with you all. People: And also with you.

Confession (P.45) - Paul

- Leader: Dear friends in Christ, as we prepare to worship almighty God, let us with penitent and obedient hearts confess our sins, that we may obtain forgiveness by his infinite goodness and mercy.
- All: Most merciful God, we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbours as ourselves. We are truly sorry and we humbly repent. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us, that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your name. Amen.

Absolution (P.46) – Rev. Maria

- Celebrant: Almighty God have mercy upon you, pardon and deliver you from all your sins, confirm and strengthen you in all goodness, and keep you in eternal life; through Jesus Christ our Lord.
- People: Amen.

Reader: Mary's Song of Praise

^{46b} 'My soul magnifies the Lord,

⁴⁷ and my spirit rejoices in God my Saviour,

⁴⁸ for he has looked with favour on the lowliness of his servant.

Surely, from now on all generations will call me blessed; ⁴⁹ for the Mighty One has done great things for me, and holy is his name.

Reader: The Birth of Jesus Foretold

²⁶ In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, ²⁷ to a virgin engaged to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. The virgin's name was Mary.²⁸ And he came to her and said, 'Greetings, favoured one! The Lord is with you.' ²⁹ But she was much perplexed by his words and pondered what sort of greeting this might be. ³⁰ The angel said to her, 'Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favour with God. ³¹ And now, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus. ³² He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his ancestor David. ³³ He will reign over the house of Jacob for ever, and of his kingdom there will be no end.' ³⁴ Mary said to the angel, 'How can this be, since I am a virgin?' ³⁵ The angel said to her, 'The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be holy; he will be called Son of God. ³⁶ And now, your relative Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son; and this is the sixth month for her who was said to be barren. ³⁷ For nothing will be impossible with God.' ³⁸ Then Mary said, 'Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word.' Then the angel departed from her.

People: Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.
