Reader: ***The Resurrection of the Dead***

¹² *Now if Christ is proclaimed as raised from the dead, how can some of you say there is no resurrection of the dead?* ¹³ *If there is no resurrection of the dead, then Christ has not been raised;* ¹⁴ *and if Christ has not been raised, then our proclamation has been in vain and your faith has been in vain.* ¹⁵ *We are even found to be misrepresenting God, because we testified of God that he raised Christ—whom he did not raise if it is true that the dead are not raised.* ¹⁶ *For if the dead are not raised, then Christ has not been raised.* ¹⁷ *If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins.* ¹⁸ *Then those also who have died in Christ have perished.* ¹⁹ *If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are of all people most to be pitied.*

²⁰ *But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have died.*
