Reader: The Lord be with you.

THE COVENANT IN MINISTRY

The Churchwardens come forward with the new Priest-in-charge and approach the Archdeacon, saying

Archdeacon, on behalf of the people of the Parish of **St. Elizabeth, Mississauga**, we ask you to proceed with the induction of **Siu Chun Leung** as our Priest-in-charge.

The Archdeacon asks the Regional Dean to read the Verification of Appointment

Archdeacon: Do you, Siu Chun,

in the presence of this congregation

to which you have been called to be priest and pastor,

commit yourself to this trust and responsibility?

Siu Chun: I do.

Members of the parish are asked to stand, as they are able.

Archdeacon: Do you, the people of the parish church of **St. Elizabeth, Mississauga**, having accepted **Siu Chun** to be your priest and pastor, commit yourselves to share with her in the ministry of this parish?

People: We do.

The Priest-in-charge faces the Congregation

Siu Chun: I, Siu Chun Leung, commit myself to you, the people of St. Elizabeth, Mississauga, as your priest and pastor, bringing my strengths and weaknesses, my hopes and concerns, my gifts and talents bestowed on me by God's grace, and will endeavour, with the help of God, to share with you in the ministry of this parish, in the name of Christ, with the empowering of the Holy Spirit.

The Parishioners respond

Parish:

We, the people of St. Elizabeth, Mississauga, commit ourselves to you as our priest and pastor, bringing our strengths and weaknesses, our hopes and concerns, our gifts and talents bestowed on us by God's grace, and will endeavour with the help of God, to share with you in the ministry of this parish, in the name of Christ, with the empowering of the Holy Spirit.

Wardens:

Siu Chun, on behalf of this Parish, and in obedience to the mandate of the Bishop, we present to you these keys and this parish list, in token that we acknowledge you as our lawful pastor and priest, in charge of this Parish.

Siu Chun:

I receive these at your hands as the pledge of your recognition of me as your appointed Priest-in-charge. Together, may we be an open, welcoming community, greeting Christ in all who come through our doors.

All others are asked to stand, as they are able.

Archdeacon: As brothers and sisters

in the Body of Christ and witnesses to this covenant,

will you support Siu Chun

and the people of St. Elizabeth, Mississauga

in their ministry together?

People: We will.

learn the ways of God's reign, patterned in worship and practiced in love. Together, may we welcome strangers, stand with outcasts, and support those who are broken, in the pattern of our Saviour Jesus Christ.

People: Hear our prayer.

Archdeacon: I ask your prayers for our worldwide Anglican

Communion, for Andrew, our Diocesan Bishop, for Kevin and Riscylla, our Suffragan Bishops, for Justin, Archbishop of Canterbury, for Linda our Primate, Ann our Metropolitan, and especially for all the parishes of this diocese, that the church at all times and in all places may bear faithful witness to

the Gospel.

People: Hear our prayer.

Leader: I ask your prayers for this City, **Mississauga**, its

Mayor and Council; for our Province of Ontario, its Premier and Legislature; for our country of Canada, the Prime Minister and Parliament; that our communities may be places of justice and freedom for

with one accord to make our common supplications to you, and you have promised through your well-beloved Son that when two or three are gathered together you will hear their requests. for you, Father, are good and loving, and we glorify you through your Son Jesus Christ our Lord, in the Holy Spirit, now and forever.

Archdeacon: Blessed are you, gracious God,

creator of heaven and earth; we give you thanks and praise through Jesus Christ our Lord,

who came not to be served, but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many.

He calls his faithful servants

to lead your holy people in love,

nourishing them by your word and sacraments.

Now with all creation we raise our voices

to proclaim the glory of your name.

Archdeacon: We give you thanks, Lord our God, for the goodness and love you have made known to us in creation; in calling Israel to be your people, in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus your Son.

For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Saviour and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness,

out of death into life.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, a death he freely accepted, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: this is my body which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me." Archdeacon: After supper he took the cup of wine;

and when he had given thanks,

he gave it to them,

and said, "Drink this, all of you:

this is my blood of the new covenant,

which is shed for you and for many

for the forgiveness of sins.

Whenever you drink it,

do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore, Father, according to his command,

we proclaim his resurrection, we await his coming in glory;

Archdeacon: and we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to

you, Lord of all;

presenting to you, from your creation,

this bread and this wine.

We pray you, gracious God,

to send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts,

that they may be the sacrament of the body of Christ

and his blood of the new covenant.

Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice,

that we, made acceptable in him,

may be sanctified by the Holy Spirit.

In the fullness of time, reconcile all things in Christ, and make them new, and bring us to that city of light

where you dwell with all your sons and daughters;

through Jesus Christ our Lord,

the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church,

and the author of our salvation;

by whom, and with whom, and in whom,

in the unity of the Holy Spirit,

all honour and glory are yours, almighty Father,

now and for ever.



And ever his glory proclaim! (**Refrain**)


