

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Reflection & Meditation Article

- "The Peak of Liturgical Life (2)"

The Passover Triduum is the three holy days commemorating the Passion and Resurrection of the Lord Jesus Christ. It is the most important moment in the life of the Lord Jesus Christ. The passion and death of Jesus Christ were integrated with the resurrection and should not be viewed separately. Traditionally, the celebrations begin after Maundy Thursday, reach the peak at the Great Vigil of Easter, and end with Vespers on Easter Day. The Passover Triduum is the highest and most important time of the entire liturgical year. By participating in these days of celebrations, believers are touched in their hearts, recall what the Lord has done for the world, give thanks to the Lord, and reconnect our entire lives with the life of the Lord while looking forward to His glorious return.

The Easter season begins on Easter Day and ends on the Day of Pentecost. It is a fifty-day period of joyful celebration. During this period, the church expresses its joy at the Lord's victory over suffering and death. The Pentecost of the Holy Spirit is the result of the Lord's crucifixion and resurrection. Jesus not only resurrected himself to new life, but also became the source of new life for all. In Christ, all people are resurrected, have a new beginning, and bear the fruit of the Holy Spirit.

Today, when believers participate in the liturgical life of the church, it is important not only to look back on the faithful life during the time of Jesus and the early church, but also to inspire believers to take on commissions and learn to be like Christ. Of course, it would renew the relationship between believers and the Lord Jesus Christ through liturgy and improve our spiritual quality. Jesus said, 'If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me.' (Luke 9:23) The value and essentiality of the cross are the core of the believer's life and the sign of the servant of God. Because of His love and sacrifice, our Lord Jesus Christ is willing to bear the sins and pains of people in exchange for releasing us from the bondage of sin. As followers of the Lord, we have to perform the redemptive effect of Jesus Christ on our lives, allowing others to know Christ and experience the power of resurrection.

For Anglicans, liturgical life and festival celebrations are an integral part of religious life. The liturgy contains the grace of God and the Word. Through our worship, Christ interacts with us, allowing us to experience his presence. I deeply hope that all brothers and sisters will experience the Lord more profoundly during the Easter season and be nourished spiritually. Amen.
